CEU Tracker

A CEU tracker can be found under the," Becoming Board Certified," heading when you scroll down. You can download this and use it to document your intermediate and advanced CEUs related AAC in preparation for when the application opens in early 2024.

Operations Manual

The operations manual committee completed their work and the final edits are in process. The manual defines the operations of the AB-AAC, its committees, and administration of AAC specialty certification.

Test Standardization Group

The Ad Hoc AAC exam question writing committee, a subcommittee of the AAC Clinical Practice Analysis Study, will adhere to principles identified by the psychometrician in selecting the group of applicants to determine the cut score (passing score) for standardization of the AAC specialty examination. We encourage everyone who is interested in becoming Board Certified and in taking the examination to submit their applications and fees as listed, with the understanding that not all applicants will participate in the cut score administration to standardize the examination. Those not selected for the cut score examination will be able to take the examination once the passing score has been determined and the examination is open.
